CHRISTMAS AT ST. MARY'S CHRISTMAS EVE:

CAROL AND CRECHE EUCHARIST, 5:00 P.M.

The "Carol and Creche" Service includes readings, carols, a brief homily, the arrangement and blessing of the Christmas Creche, and celebration of the Holy Eucharist. Although the service is especially appropriate for children, it is a special part of the Christmas observance for many adults as well.

"MIDNIGHT MASS" - 11:00 P.M.

The Midnight ChristMass is a solemn celebration of the Holy Eucharist, Rite I, and includes familiar carols and congregational music, choral and instrumental anthems, and sermon. Incense will be used. This is the principal celebration of Christmas.
